1: Governing Rules:

The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of the Motor Sports Association, (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions that Enniskillen Motor Club Limited may issue for the event.

MSA. Permit No: 98508 has been issued for the Event, National 'B'.

A Trophy Rally Event will be also run at this Rally for the second half of the Event.

MSA. Permit No: 2017/009 has been issued for the 2017 MSA NI Stage Rally Championship.

The event is a round of the following championships:

Round 5 of the MSA ANICC Northern Ireland Stage Rally Championship.

Round 6 of the Valvoline Irish National Forestry Rally Championship.

Round 6 of the Enniskillen Motor Club Limited Championship.

This event is open to all fully elected members of any club, which is a member of the Association of Northern Ireland Car Clubs, the Scottish Association of Car Clubs, the Association of North East & Cumbria Car Clubs, or any club which is affiliated to Motorsport Ireland

All competitors must produce a valid competition licence of the required grade, issued by the MSA, or by Motorsport Ireland and a current and valid club membership card and, where applicable, a valid entrants licence.

2: SCRUTINY:

Noise Testing and Vehicle Scrutiny will take place between the hours of 19:00 to 21:30 hrs Friday 1st September and 06:30 to 08:30 hrs Saturday 2nd September 2017 at Grosvenor Barracks, Coleshill Road, Enniskillen, Co Fermanagh.

Documentation & Signing-on will take place between the hours of 19:00 to 21:30 hrs Friday 1st September and 06:30 and 08:30 on Saturday, 2nd September 2017, at Grosvenor Barracks, Coleshill Road, Enniskillen, Co Fermanagh.

Any competitor not signed on by 08:30 hrs on Saturday, 2nd September 2017 will be excluded.

A Competitors' briefing will take place at 09:00 hrs on Saturday 2nd September at Grosvenor Barracks, Coleshill Road, Enniskillen, Co Fermanagh.

Attendance is compulsory for all competitors under pain of exclusion.

Checks may be carried out to confirm compliance with this regulation.

Start times will be posted at the Start Control (MC1 Out).

Cars will start at one-minute intervals.

3: SPECIAL STAGES:

The event will consist of six special stages on unsealed forestry roads, with a mileage of approximately 40 stage miles. These stages will be timed to an accuracy of one second [R31.1.3].

The starting signal will be given by means of a traffic-light system. In the event of a failure of the traffic-light system, the starting signal will be given by the control official lifting a flag away from the windscreen. Special stages will be defined in a road book provided by the organisers [R29.1.6]

Reconnaissance or examination of any part of a special stage is expressly forbidden. Any competitor who breaches this regulation will be excluded from the event and reported to the Motors Sports Association. However, Safety Notes are permitted [R25.9], and will be available at Documentation at an additional cost to the competitor. The organisers cannot be held responsible for the content or accuracy of these safety notes. Further details regarding Safety Notes will be posted on the Club website in due course on www.enniskillenmotorclub.co.uk

4: TROPHY RALLY:

This is a supplementary event to the main rally, which is being provided by the Organisers to permit Competitors who retire from the main event on Special Stages 1 & 2 only, the opportunity to have further competition re-starting from Special Stage 4. Vehicles <u>MUST</u> be re-scrutineered for conformity. This scrutineering will take place at a specific designated area at the event service park. This specific area will be named in Final Instructions issued prior to the commencement of the Event. Trophy Rally entry forms will be available at the main event scrutiny documentation sign-on on the Friday evening and on the Saturday morning. Competition may only commence at a predetermined time during this event, which on this rally will be from starting at the Service Out Control prior to Special Stage 4. Competitors taking part on the Trophy Rally section will run behind the main event or may be re-seeded at the Clerk of the Course's discretion. Results will be displayed along with the results for the main event and awards will be presented at the event Prize Giving at the Rally Finish venue.

5: RALLY DECALS:

Rally plates and Hi-vis competition numbers will be supplied by the organisers, and must be fitted before the vehicle is presented for scrutiny. These numbers must be displayed as instructed. Competitors taking part in the Trophy Rally event will continue to use the same competition numbers that they were issued for the main event. **NO** new decals will be issued for the Trophy Rally event.

Any decals and/or numbers relating to any other event must be removed before presentation of the vehicle for scrutiny.

Space must be made available for the event sponsors decals, which must be displayed at all times during the event.

Cars failing to display event sponsors decals will be excluded. See article 4 in the 2017 ANICC MSA NI Stage Rally Championship Regulations

6: CLASSES:

The event will consist of twelve classes as per Article 5 of the ANICC MSA 2017 NI Stage Rally Championship regulations, and are as follows:

Classes:

Class 1 - Group N cars up to and including 2000cc (see Article 5.12 for definition).

Class 2 - Group N cars over 2000cc (see Article 5.12 for definition).

Class 3 - Cars up to and including 1450cc and cars from 1451cc up to and including 1650cc;

having not more than 2 valves per cylinder - 2-wheel drive only.

Class 4 - Cars from 1451cc up to and including 1650cc, having more than 2 valves per cylinder – 2-wheel drive cars only, including R2 cars (VR2C).

Class 5 - Cars from 1651cc up to and including 2100cc, having not more than 2 valves per cylinder. – 2-wheel drive cars only.

Class 6 -- Cars from 1651cc up to and including 2100cc having more than two valves per cylinder. 2-wheel drive cars only, including R3 cars (VR3C).

Class 7 -- Cars over 2100cc. 2-wheel drive only.

Class 8 – Any 4wd car not classified in Class 9 or 10.

Class 9 - All current and previously homologated WRC cars.

Class 10 – S2000-Rally: 1.6T engine with a 30mm restrictor, S2000 – Rally 2.0 Atmospheric, Group R5 (VR5), Group R4 (VR4).

Historic Classes:

Class 11 – Historic rally cars registered before 31/12/1985 (MSA Cat 1, 2, 3, & 4 Ref: R49 – 2017 MSA Blue Book).

Class 12 – Historic rally cars complying with FIA Appendix K (Ref: R49.4 – 2017 MSA Blue Book) (See Article 5.14)

<u>Notes:</u> The Overall Category is open to all classes (1 - 12).

The Group N Category is open to competitors in Classes 1 and 2. Cars eligible for Classes 1 and 2 are those, which are, or have at any time been homologated in Group N under FIA Appendix J, also any Series Production car that is, or has been, available for general sale in Northern Ireland. MSA ANICC Northern Ireland Stage Rally 2017 Championship Regulations apply 5.1 to 5.16. The onus for proving eligibility for Classes 1 and 2 rests solely with the entrant.

A valid MSA Engine Certificate must be produced for any MG Metro 6R4.

A Rotary-engined car's class will be determined by the actual cubic capacity x 2.

A turbocharged car's class will be determined by the actual cubic capacity x 1.7.

The onus rests entirely on the competitor to enter the correct class. Any car found to be in the wrong class after the event has started will be excluded from the results.

All cars must have an MI or MSA log book. [R25.2 & R46.1.3]

All cars must have a current valid MOT / Vehicle Test certificate, where required by law for the vehicle. [R46.1.1 & R46.1.2]

Awards will be presented as follows: -1st Overall – 2 trophies 2nd Overall – 2 trophies 3rd Overall – 2 trophies

1st in each Class – 2 trophies

2nd in each Class – 2 trophies (3 or more starters)

3rd in each Class – 2 trophies (6 or more starters)

Highest placed Enniskillen Motor Club crew – 2 trophies (driver and co-driver must be fully elected 2017 EMC members)

Trophy Rally: Winner – 2 trophies Additional awards may be presented at the discretion of the Event Organising Team. Any awards not collected within 10 days will be forfeited!

7: ENTRIES:

The maximum entry for the meeting is 120 cars. Should this be exceeded, selection shall be solely at the discretion of the organisers. [D14.1.1]

The minimum entry for the event is 60 cars. The minimum entry for each class is two cars. Should these minimum figures not be met, the organisers reserve the right to cancel the event, or amalgamate classes as necessary. [D10.1.17]

The Entry List opens on publication of these Supplementary Regulations.

Entries close – on Tuesday 29th August 2017.

[NOTE: THE DATE AN ENTRY IS PLACED WILL BE DETERMINED BY THE DATE OF RECEIPT, AND NOT BY THE DATE OF POSTING]

Entry fee £330.00 Sterling or €400.00 Euro, - Plus Road Traffic Insurance (RTI).

Enniskillen Motor Club Limited Club membership [if required] is £10.00 Sterling per person, however if any competitor who is already a paid-up member of any MSA or MI Club and has their 2017 membership card with them as proof at documentation they will be exempt from taking out EMC Ltd Club Membership for this event.

Incomplete entry forms, and those not accompanied by the appropriate TOTAL fee will NOT be accepted. **ONLY** postal, or hand delivered, or online entries on the official entry form will be accepted.

All cheques should be crossed and made payable to "Enniskillen Motor Club Limited". Post-dated cheques will not be accepted.

The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry. Such a refusal will be notified in writing. The entry list and final instructions will be posted on the Enniskillen Motor Club Limited website: www.enniskillenmotorclub.co.uk by Wednesday 30th August 2017.

Priority will be given to competitors who are registered for the MSA Northern Ireland Rally Championship and the Valvoline Irish Forest Championship up to Tuesday 22nd August 2017.

The entry list will be seeded on the basis of anticipated performance [R24.1.4]. On the entry form, competitors will be asked to list previous results; failure to provide such information may result in a lower seeding than might be expected.

9: RESULTS:

Provisional results will be posted as soon as possible after the event on the Official Noticeboard, at Rally Finish Venue. All queries must be addressed through the Competitor Liaison Officer. Any protest must be lodged in accordance with C5.1.2, 5.2.1 and C5.2.2. Any appeal against a decision of the Clerk-of-the-Course must be made in accordance with C6.1, C6.2 and C6.3.

10: EVENT ROUTE INFORMATION:

Roadbooks, timecards and details of the route, including all special stages will be issued to Competitors at Documentation. These documents will allow competitors to comply with R26.1.

Competitors are reminded of the Control Procedure [R30.2] – penalties will be applied for early or late arrival at a control.

Servicing will only be permitted in an area designated by the organizers. Any crew found receiving or organising outside assistance in any other area will be excluded.

11: PENALTIES:

Penalties will be applied as follows: -

- 1 Achieving a time less than the minimum time for a special stage TARGET TIME
- 2 Achieving a time greater than the maximum time for a special stage MAXIMUM TIME
- 3 Achieving a time which is between 1 and 2 above ACTUAL TIME
- 4 Failure to attempt a special stage MAXIMUM TIME
- 5 Failure to follow a specified route on a special stage MAXIMUM TIME
- 6 Failure to start a special stage when instructed MAXIMUM TIME
- 7 Blocking a special stage MAXIMUM TIME+ 2 mins

8 - Failure to comply with an instruction from an official, provided a warning that a penalty may be applied is given 15 minutes

- 9 Excessive noise, damaged or ineffective silencing system EXCLUSION
- 10 Any unauthorized person found trespassing on any stage EXCLUSION
- 11 Reporting at a Control after due time 10 seconds per minute
- 12 Reporting at a Control before due time 20 seconds per minute
- 13 Failure to surrender a time card to an official when instructed to do so 15 minutes
- 14 Service vehicle failing to adhere to specified route [R38.1.3] EXCLUSION
- 15 Exceeding Maximum Lateness (15 minutes) at any control EXCLUSION
- 16 Not reporting at a Control EXCLUSION
- 17 Not providing proof of visiting a Control EXCLUSION
- 18 Not visiting Controls in the required sequence EXCLUSION
- 19 Failure by either member of the crew to wear a properly fastened crash helmet on any special stage EXCLUSION
- 20 Receiving assistance contrary to R38.1.2 or R38.1.4 EXCLUSION
- 21 Misuse of SOS/OK board EXCLUSION & reported to the MSA
- 22 Reported breach of Road Traffic laws EXCLUSION
- 23 Abuse of an official by a competitor or a member of their Service Crew EXCLUSION & reported to the MSA
- 24 Breach of R48.10.9 EXCLUSION.

All other penalties are as outlined in the MSA Yearbook 2017

The following regulations have been amended:

R31.2.5 Maximum Permitted Lateness is 15 minutes

G10.1 Judges of Fact may be appointed in relation to illegal servicing, false starts, etc.

12: COMPETITOR INFORMATION:

Please note the following:

The driver must hold a valid current Driving Licence

Each competing vehicle must have a valid Competition Car Log Book [R46.1.3]

Both crew-members must produce a current competition licence, valid for the status and type of the event. [See Chart 26 on page 142, MSA Yearbook 2017 for details of acceptable licences. See also H26.1.4 and H26.1.5].

A competitor who is unable to produce a valid competition licence may subject to approval by the MSA Steward sign a Non-production of Licence Declaration and pay a non-refundable fine of £67.00 [H22.1.2].

Each competing vehicle must carry, at all times, a red reflective triangle and an SOS/OK board complying with R25.4 & R48.10.9. Spot checks may be carried out at any time during the event to ensure compliance with this regulation – see Article 11.24 of these ASR's for penalty!

It is strongly recommended that all competing cars carry a First Aid kit.

All competing vehicles must carry a self-contained spill kit, capable of absorbing minor spillages of up to 1.5 litres of vehicle fluids (see 2017 NI Championship Regulations, Article 5.11).

13: INSURANCE (RTI):

The Organisers have applied to Jelf Insurance Partnership for a Blanket Cover Note under the above scheme. This will provide competitors who need to use the scheme with the Third Party Cover necessary to meet RTA requirements on the Road Sections of the event.

The basic rate for the event before any loadings will be **£20.00.** All applicants wishing to use the scheme must be able to comply with all points of the Jelf Insurance Partnership's Declaration: -

- I do not have the Third Party Road Section extension on my current Motor Insurance.
- I am aged 20 or over.
- I have had no more than 1 fault claim in the last three years
- I have no more than maximum of 6 conviction points on my UK driving licence
- I have the appropriate competition/club membership licence as well as a UK/EU driving license and if my license is provisional I will be supervised by an adult over 25.
- I have no physical or mental disabilities
- I have no other material facts to disclose
- Anyone aged less than 20 years old will also be accepted at the same price should their co-driver be a more senior member of their family or over 25.

If you comply with all points above, no Letter of Acceptance will be required. If unable to comply with any of the above points you will be required to complete the Declaration form (the form can be obtained by contacting Jackie Elliott on 0788 407 4168) which should be forwarded to Jackie prior to the event to allow sufficient time for a letter of acceptance to be issued. <u>NO LETTER = NO START!</u>

Any competitor, or member of a service crew, who directly or indirectly abuses an official of this event either verbally or by any other means will be excluded and reported to the MSA.

Organiser's liability:

The organisers decline liability in any accident or situation caused by, or to competitors, and the competing cars during the whole of the event. The organisers also decline any liability for breach of the laws and regulations of Northern Ireland covered by the itinerary. Competitors shall be held responsible for any accident on public or private land. Competitors must declare to the organisers any breach of laws in which they may be involved and shall also declare to the organisers the particulars of any incident from which liability may arise. They shall have no claim against the organisers arising out of any action of the organizers, their servants or officials, during the course of the rally.

Advertising:

Competitors must provide a space of 645 cms² on each side of the two front doors of the competing car for additional sponsor advertising [H29.1.2].

If the event is being televised, competitors are reminded that there are strict legal restrictions on the advertising of tobacco [H28.1.6] and alcohol. If you require more information regarding this, please contact the Secretary of the Meeting.

DECLARATION OF INDEMNITY:

By the very fact of signing the entry form, the entrant, as well as the crew members submits themselves to the sporting jurisdictions specified in the International Sporting Code of the FIA and accept unreservedly these regulations, the General Regulations of the Motor Sports Association (MSA).

"I declare that I have been given the opportunity to read the General Regulations of the Motor Sports Association and if any the Supplementary Regulations for this event and agree to be bound by them. I declare that I am physically and mentally fit to take part in the event and I am competent to do so. I acknowledge that I understand the nature and type of competition and the potential risk inherent with motor sport and agree to accept that risk.

I understand that motorsport can be dangerous and accidents causing death, injury, disability and property damage can and do happen. I understand that these risks may give rise to my suffering personal injury or other loss and I acknowledge and accept these risks."

"In consideration of the acceptance of this entry I agree that neither any one of or any combination of the MSA and its associated clubs, the organisers, the track owners or other occupiers, the promoters and their respective officers, servants, representatives and agents (the "Parties") shall have any liability for loss or damage which may be sustained or incurred by me as a result of participation in the Event including but not limited to damage to property, economic loss, consequential loss or financial loss howsoever caused. Nothing in this clause is intended to or shall be deemed to exclude or limit liability for death or personal injury. To the fullest extent permitted by law I agree to indemnify and hold harmless each of the Parties in respect of any loss or damage whatsoever and howsoever arising from my participation in the Event.

"I declare That to the best of my belief the driver(s) possess (es) the standard of competence necessary for an event of the type to which this entry relates and that the vehicle entered is suitable and roadworthy for the event having regard to the course and the speeds which will be reached."

STATE YOUR AGE IF YOU ARE UNDER 18:

"I declare that the use of the vehicle hereby entered will be covered by insurance as required by the law which is valid for such part of this event as shall take place on roads as defined by the law."

"I understand that should I at the time of this event be suffering from any disability whether permanent or temporary which is likely to affect prejudicially my normal control of my vehicle, I may not take part unless I have declared such disability to the ASN which has following such declaration, issued a licence which permits me to do so."

"I undertake that at the time of the event to which this entry relates I shall have passed or am exempt from an ASN specified medical examination within the specified period", if required.
