- 13. Provisional results will be published after the event; in accordance with D26.1.2
- 14. Protests must be lodged in accordance with C5.
- 15. Entrants will be supplied with Time Cards and details of the special stages at the documentation scrutiny. Servicing will only be permitted in the area specified in the final instructions.
- 16. Competitors will be identified by regulation size competition numbers, which **will** be supplied by the organisers. These numbers must be affixed to each vehicle and must be in position before the vehicle is presented for scrutiny.
- 17. Marking and penalties will be as per R32.2 with the alterations/ additions of the following.
- 18. The following regulations have been amended as follows:
- R40.1 To be classified as a finisher, a competitor must report to all controls listed in the road book/time Cards and report to the final control within their maximum cumulative lateness.
- R40.1.2 In the event of a tie, the competitor with the fastest time on the last stage will be the winner, and Penultimate stage and so on until a winner be obtained.
- R31.2.5 Maximum permitted lateness will be 15minutes.
- R32.1.1 Competitors will be required to reduce lateness by either foregoing or reducing any period of time provided for remaining at a control or official halt.
- 19. Any competitor who practices, reconnoitres or otherwise examines a special stage or uses any other person(s) to do so on their behalf will be excluded from the event and will be reported to the MSA. **This will be strictly enforced**. Members of the

organising committee who are setting up the event are excluded from this requirement – without their help, there would be no event.

- 20. Interpretation of regulations. It is not the duty of any marshal to interpret regulations or any other written instructions to a competitor or to explain the meaning of and/or effect thereof. - 2. The meeting will be held under the general regulations of the MSA Limited (incorporating the provisions of the international sporting code of the FIA) and these supplementary regulations and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for the event.
- 3. MSA Permit Number:77578
- 4. The meeting is open to fully elected members of the organising club and the following invited clubs:
 Ballynahinch & district Motor club, Cookstown motor club, Dungannon motor club, Enniskillen motor club,
 Larne motor club, Magherafelt & district motor club, Maiden city motor club, Mid Antrim motor club, Newry &
 district motor club, North Armagh motor club, North Ulster motor club, Omagh motor club, queens university

- 5. All competitors must produce:
 - DRIVERS must have the minimum of a National B Stage Rally licence, which cannot be applied for on the day
 - CO DRIVERS may apply on the day for a non-race National B completion licence but only by

Competitors failing to attend scrutiny at the time stated in Final instructions will be penalised as per R5.1.1. Any competitor not signed on by 9:00am Sunday 7th July will be excluded and their place will be taken by a competitor from the reserve entry list, should one exist, or failing this may be requested to take up a place at the end of the starting list. At scrutiny cars will be examined for compliance with tyres and vehicle safety regulations as well as for class eligibility. All vehicles must comply with MSA technical regulationsJ, R46-48. A noise test will be carried out prior to vehicle scrutiny as per J5.18

- 6.2. Start times: Cars will start at 30 second intervals; the first car will start 10am on Sunday 7th July 2013. Individual times of start will be advised at drivers' briefing to be held at 9:15am in service area. H33.1.3.

- 7.2 Turbo engine cars class determined by capacity x 1.7.
 Rotary engine cars class determined by capacity x 2.
- 7.3 Vehicle Regulations for class 1 and 2
- 7.3.1 Cars eligible for class 1 and 2 are those, which are or have at any time been homologated in Group N as defined in FIA J. Also any production car which has been available for general sale in Northern Ireland.
