The organizers have reserved the right to cancel or postpone the event or part of it in exceptional circumstances.

ENTRIES

Entries are open to all drivers whom hold a current competition license and log book which must be produced at scrutiny.

Entries are open on publication of these regulations

Competitors will be excluded from the results for the following offences.

- 1 Unofficial Practice in any type of vehicle.
- 2 Failure to wear safety belt and crash helmet of the approved type while on the course.
- 3 Failure to have appropriate type fire extinguisher in the car at all times during the event
- 4 Failure to pass scrutiny or to arrive at scrutiny after practice has begun.
- 5 Failure to obey a reasonable request from an official.



SCRUTINY REQUIREMENTS

All competing vehicles must carry a Seat Belt Cutter

All cars must pass scrutiny

All cars must be fitted with fire extinguishers of approved type

All cars must be fitted with full roll cage and have laminated windscreens.

All cars must be fitted with FIA approved seats.

Fire proof clothing must be worn as per MI regulations.

Overhead/ floor skid pans and side netting are compulsory on specials.

Seats, safety belts and helmets of approved type must be used. See specification in current yearbook and latest MI bulletins.

CLASSES:

Class 1: All Saloon cars up to 1450 cc

Class 2: All Saloon cars from 1451 cc to 1650 cc with not more than 2 valves per cylinder.

Class 3: All Saloon cars from 1451 cc to 1650 cc with more than 2 valves per cylinder.

Class 4: All Saloon cars from 1651 cc to 2100 cc

Class 5: All Saloon cars over 2100 cc, 4WD & Turbo Charged Saloon Cars.

Class 6: Motorcycle Engined Specials over 1250cc up to 1400cc Maximum. Only open to competitors 17 years and over.

Class 7: Car Engined Specials. Only open to competitors 17 years and over.

Class 8: "Intermediate class" for 16 – 18 year olds, holding a "Speed National B" licence in saloon cars up to 1650cc. Class 9: "Junior class" for 14 – 16 year olds, holding a "Junior" licence in saloon cars up to 1450cc. Drivers in class 8, 9 & 13 must be 13 to 18 years old respectively on the 1st Day of the Championship Year.

Class 10: Motorcycle Engined Specials including Buggies up to 600cc. Only open to competitors 17 years and over. Class 11: Motorcycle Engined Specials including Buggies from 601cc to 750cc. Only open to competitors 17 years and over.

Class 12: Motorcycle Engined Specials 751cc to 1249cc. Only open to competitors 17 years and over.

Class 13: J1000 For holders of Junior Speed licences with cars complying to J1000 Technical Regulations as published on MI website, Co drivers are compulsory and must hold a minimum of National B competition licence and be 21 years old or over. Drivers must be 13 - 16 years of age.

Ladies Class: Any of the above

Notes on Classes

Drivers in class 8, 9 & 13 must be 13 to 18 years old respectively on the 1st Day of the Championship Year.

Maximum Engine Capacities are as Follows: Motorcycle Engine Buggy is 1000cc Motorcycle Engine Special is 1400cc Car Engine Special is 4000cc

The onus rests with the competitor to enter a class for which their car is eligible. Classes are final at event mechanical scrutiny.

FTD Specials/Buggies, FTD 2wd Saloons & FTD 4wd Saloons, 1^{ST} , 2^{ND} & 3^{RD} in each class, Ladies Award and Best Newcomer.



Winners of the overall award will not be eligible for class awards. Additional awards may be presented.

Protests will only be accepted as per MI regulations. No case for force majeure will be considered once a competitor has started the event.

MULTIPLE DRIVERS:

- A maximum of three drivers will be permitted per competing car.
- Each driver will be permitted one untimed familiarisation run during which stopping or holding back unnecessarily on the track is prohibited. This is not a competitive run.
- Please ensure the first individual double driver is prepared to start their run early to ensure there are no hold ups or delays.
- Please ensure double drivers are ready to take their turn as soon as the first driver finishes their timed run.
- You must notify the Event Secretary when entering if you intend to double drive with another competitor.

COMPETITION:

Overtaking is not allowed. Any competitor who feels he/she has been baulked/delayed by another competitor or has been yellow flagged by a Marshal can request a re-run but must do so immediately on return to the Paddock. A re-run will only be granted at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course. Deliberate delay in taking a run as scheduled will result in forfeit of the run.

PENALTIES:

Penalties will be applied as per Appendix 86, Art. 2. Competition cars must not leave the venue under their own power at any time, before, during or after the event. The penalty for breach of this regulation is EXCLUSION.

Please comply with the direction of marshals and officials who are there for your safety.

TIMING/RESULTS:

Timing will be to the nearest 1/100th second from a standing start to a flying finish and in accordance with Appendix 86 Art. 9.7 of the current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook. The Timekeeper's times will be judged as final and correct. Results will be based on a competitor's fastest time (including penalties) for 1 run. The competitor with the overall fastest time (including penalties) for 1 run will be the winner.

If a competitor is unable to complete a timed run, a run maximum of 10 minutes will be applied.

THE CLERK OF THE COURSE HAS THE RIGHT TO REFUSE AN ENTRY without having to assign a reason.

MOTORSPORT IRELAND SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY

Purpose – Motorsport Ireland (MI) have created this policy document to ensure that any individual involved in any form of motorsport in Ireland, which is governed by MI, understand and agree to their responsibilities when using social media and in particular when posting content to any form of social media or to any Internet Websites, blogs, forums or message boards.

The Competitor / Official named hereunder hereby, by signing this document, agrees and understands as follows-

- 1. This policy document covers all those involved within the sport whether they are a Competitor, Entrant, Parent of a Competitor or Entrant, Team Official, Race Official or Motorsport Ireland Official whilst participating under Motorsport Ireland regulations regardless of their original national ASN. This policy is referred to in the entry forms for all events and is binding upon Competitors from other national ASNs in that manner.
- 2. Any content submitted online through the medium of the Internet by those participating or officiating at Motorsport Ireland sanctioned events should not contain material that could be deemed to be threatening, harassing, bullying, illegal, obscene, defamatory, slanderous or hostile towards any individual, team or entity participating or officiating at Motorsport Ireland sanctioned events or the Governing Body, Motorsport Ireland.
- 3.Content is defined as text, images, audio, video and any user generated content knowingly uploaded to the internet.
- 4.Furthermore it is the responsibility of those who participate or officiate at Motorsport Ireland sanctioned events to make sure that any third party associated with them does not submit content online which would be in breach of this policy. If a third party submits such content which is clearly associated with the participant or official, it is the participant or official who will be held responsible by Motorsport Ireland for the breach of this policy. In this regard the onus is on the participant or official to prove that the third party is not in any way associated with them.
- 5. All those who participate or officiate at Motorsport Ireland sanctioned events are reminded that the General Competition Rules, as defined within the current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook and / or Motorsport Ireland Website, apply at all times and that failure to adhere to the policies set out in this document will result in a breach of those regulations and the penalties and sanctions as set out in the current Yearbook and /or Website will apply.
- 6. By signing this document as a competitor or official partaking in a Motorsport Ireland event you are deemed by the Governing Body to have made yourself aware of the content of both this policy and the General Competition Rules relevant to you and agree to comply with same. Furthermore you are aware of the adjudication process and penalties applicable upon breaching this policy as are set out in the General Competition Rules.
- 7. By signing this document you are agreeing that you are fully aware and understand also that the Rights of Appeal and Appeals Process, as set out in the current Motorsport Ireland yearbook and / or website, apply.
- 8. I/we the undersigned hereby understand and agree to the terms of this policy and I further hereby undertake to uphold the spirit and nature of this policy.
