Counting Round of the Shannon Trophies National Grass Surface Autocross Championship Counting Round of the Barrett International Transport and CJN Plant Munster Autocross Championship

The event will be held under the General Competition Rules of Motorsport Ireland (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), Appendix 85.1, 85.2, 86 & 87 of the 2024 M.I Yearbook, these supplementary regulations, and any further regulations which may be issued. This event will incorporate MRCCI competitors who will run in accordance with Appendix 92 of the M.I. Yearbook. This event is organised by Birr & District Motor Club. M.I Permit No: 24/100.

ENTRIES:

Entries are open to all drivers who hold a current valid competition licence and log book which must be produced at scrutiny.

Entries are open on publication of these regulations.

Competitors will be excluded from the results for the following offences:

- 1 Unofficial Practice in any type of vehicle.
- 2 Failure to wear safety belt and crash helmet of the approved type while on the course.
- 3 Failure to have appropriate type fire extinguisher in the car at all times during the event
- 4 Failure to pass scrutiny or to arrive at scrutiny after practice has begun.
- 5 Failure to obey a reasonable request from an official.

Entry Fee of €120 Main field, €75 for Class 8, 9A, 9B and 13 competitors, inclusive of Personal Accident Premium.

SCRUTINY:

- All competition vehicles must pass scrutiny in accordance with Appendix 2 of the current MI Yearbook.
- Car bodywork must be in presentable condition.
- Safety equipment MUST include a safety harness and a securely fitted 1.75 Kg minimum AFFF (or FIA Approved equivalent) Fire Extinguisher, as per Appendix 2 of the current MI Yearbook.
- Helmets, FHR devices and protective clothing must comply with standards set out in Appendices 2 & 5 for Autocross events in the current MI Yearbook.
- Mud flaps are obligatory on all wheels.
- Please co-operate with marshals and officials.
- As per Appendix 86 9.8, Smoking is strictly prohibited in the Paddock or Service Area.

MULTIPLE DRIVERS:

- A maximum of three drivers will be permitted per competing car.
- Each driver will be permitted one lap of an untimed familiarisation run during which stopping or holding back unnecessarily on the track is prohibited. Classes 8, 9A, 9B and 13 should complete a minimum of two laps. This is not a competitive run.
- You must notify the Event Secretary when entering if you intend to double or treble drive with another competitor.

COMPETITION:

The event will consist of 4 timed runs. Each run will be of 3 laps of the track. The best timed run of 1 and 2 will be totalled with the best timed run of 3 and 4 to give overall times. The track may be modified after round 2 to avoid ruts in the track. Overtaking is not allowed.

Any competitor who feels he/she has been baulked/delayed by another competitor or has been yellow flagged by a Marshal can request a re-run but must do so immediately on return to the Paddock. A re-run will only be granted at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.

Deliberate delay in taking a run as scheduled will result in forfeit of the run.

Unofficial practice, failure to pass scrutiny or late arrival will lead to exclusion. All cars must comply with Appendix 2 of the current M.I Yearbook-Scrutiny requirements. A maximum of 3 drivers per car will be allowed but the onus will be on the competitors to have the correct competition number clearly displayed. The club accepts no responsibility for mistakes in timing due to the wrong number being displayed.

The track will be marked with flags and arrows. A penalty of 5 seconds will be incurred for striking or passing on the wrong side of a standing Red marker/Flag.

Claims for Baulking must be made at the end of the run in which it occurred.

Dangerous driving and Unruly Behaviour will be dealt with by the COC.

The official Timekeepers, Officials and Flag Marshall's will be Judges of Fact and will be deemed to be correct at all times.

The appropriate fee must accompany protests.

PENALTIES:

Penalties will be applied as per Appendix 86, Art. 2 in current yearbook.

Competition cars must not leave the venue under their own power at any time, before, during or after the event. The penalty for breach of this regulation is EXCLUSION.

A Time penalty of 30 seconds will be applied to a competitor's fastest time of the day for failure to comply with directions or instructions from marshals.

TIMING & RESULTS:

Timing will be to the nearest 1/100th second from a standing start to a flying finish and in accordance with Appendix 86 Art. 9.7 of the current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook.

The Timekeeper's times will be judged as final and correct. Results will be based on a competitor's fastest time (including penalties) for 1 run. The competitor with the overall fastest time (including penalties) for 1 run will be the winner. If a competitor is unable to complete a timed run, a run maximum of 10 minutes will be applied.

CLASSES:

- 1 Saloons and Sports Cars up to 1450cc with engine over driven wheels.
- 2 Saloons and Sports Cars 1451cc to 1650cc with engine over driven wheels.
- 3 All other Saloons and Sports Cars to 1650cc.
- 4 Saloons and Sports Cars over 1651cc with engine over driven wheels.
- All other Saloons & Sports Cars not qualifying for Class 1, 2, 3 & 4. Super Saloons & all 4WD Cars will run in this Class.
- 6 Motorcycle Engined Specials over 1250cc up to 1400cc Maximum. Only open to competitors 17 Years and over.
- 7 Car Engined Specials. Only open to competitors 17 Years and over.
- 8 "Intermediate class" for 16-18 year olds, holding a "Speed National B" licence in saloon cars up to 1650cc
- 9A "Junior Saloon Class" for 14 16 year olds holding a "Junior" Licence in Saloon Cars up to 1450cc
- J1000 drivers aged 13 16 who are holders of Junior Speed licences with cars complying to the J1000 Technical Regulations as published on the MI Website. Passenger/Mentor as per Appendix 85.1.24.
- Motorcycle Engined Specials including Buggies up to 600cc. Only open to competitors 17 Years and over.
- 11 Motorcycle Engined Specials including Buggies from 601cc to 750cc. Only open to competitors 17 Years and over.
- 12 Motorcycle Engined Specials 751cc to 1249cc. Only open to competitors 18 year and over.
- Motorcycle Engined Buggies up to 600cc (Restricted). Only open to competitors between 13 and 16 years of age holding a Junior Speed Licence. Please see Appendix 85.1 Notes on Classes for specifications.
- 14 Midget Racing Cars as per Appendix 92

Notes on classes:

Driver in Class 8, 9A, 9B & 13 must be 13-18 years old respectively on the First Day of the Championship Year Maximum engine capacities are as follows:

Motorcycle Engine Buggy is 1000cc, Motorcycle Engine Special is 1400cc, Car Engine Special is 4000cc and Junior Buggy Class is 600cc (restricted).

The onus rests with the competitor to enter a class for which their car is eligible. Classes are final at scrutiny.

AWARDS:

FTD: Fastest Time of the Day. Fastest Saloon Driver (Class 1,2,3 & 4), Fastest Super Saloon Driver (Class 5) and Fastest Special/Buggy Driver (Class 6, 7, 10, 11 & 12).

Class Awards: 1st, 2nd and 3rd awards in each class regardless of the number of competitors.

Ladies Awards: should also be made for 1st, 2nd and 3rd in the Ladies not receiving another class award.

Novice Award: should be made for the best Novice where applicable.

Highest place Club Member not receiving any other award.

SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY

MOTORSPORT IRELAND

Purpose – Motorsport Ireland (MI) have created this policy document to ensure that any individual involved in any form of motorsport in Ireland, which is governed by MI, understand and agree to their responsibilities when using social media and in particular when posting content to any form of social media or to any Internet Websites, blogs, forums or message boards.

The Competitor / Official named hereunder hereby, by signing this document, agrees and understands as follows-

- 1. This policy document covers all those involved within the sport whether they are a Competitor, Entrant, Parent of a Competitor or Entrant, Team Official, Race Official or Motorsport Ireland Official whilst participating under Motorsport Ireland regulations regardless of their original national ASN. This policy is referred to in the entry forms for all events and is binding upon Competitors from other national ASNs in that manner.
- 2. Any content submitted online through the medium of the Internet by those participating or officiating at Motorsport Ireland sanctioned events should not contain material that could be deemed to be threatening, harassing, bullying, illegal, obscene, defamatory, slanderous or hostile towards any individual, team or entity participating or officiating at Motorsport Ireland sanctioned events or the Governing Body, Motorsport Ireland.
- 3. Content is defined as text, images, audio, video and any user generated content knowingly uploaded to the internet.
- 4. Furthermore it is the responsibility of those who participate or officiate at Motorsport Ireland sanctioned events to make sure that any third party associated with them does not submit content online which would be in breach of this policy. If a third party submits such content which is clearly associated with the participant or official, it is the participant or official who will be held responsible by Motorsport Ireland for the breach of this policy. In this regard the onus is on the participant or official to prove that the third party is not in any way associated with them.
- 5. All those who participate or officiate at Motorsport Ireland sanctioned events are reminded that the General Competition Rules, as defined within the current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook and / or Motorsport Ireland Website, apply at all times and that failure to adhere to the policies set out in this document will result in a breach of those regulations and the penalties and sanctions as set out in the current Yearbook and /or Website will apply.
- 6. By signing this document as a competitor or official partaking in a Motorsport Ireland event you are deemed by the Governing Body to have made yourself aware of the content of both this policy and the General Competition Rules relevant to you and agree to comply with same. Furthermore you are aware of the adjudication process and penalties applicable upon breaching this policy as are set out in the General Competition Rules.
- 7. By signing this document you are agreeing that you are fully aware and understand also that the Rights of Appeal and Appeals Process, as set out in the current Motorsport Ireland yearbook and / or website, apply.
- 8. I/we the undersigned hereby understand and agree to the terms of this policy and I further hereby undertake to uphold the spirit and nature of this policy.
